Mike welcomed everyone, explained the voting procedures for members, and noted the meeting was being recorded.

#### 4. Presentation of the Annual Report CEO's Report

- NH noted the hard work of all the staff, trustees, and volunteers and thanked them, noting RSG's support of volunteers needed to improve.
- NH called for greater inter-agency coordination with Statutory Authorities to support dispersed asylum seekers.
- NH introduced the RSG Impact Report.
- The RSG name change was explained briefly.

There were no questions.

The RRSG Annual Report 2021 – 2022 was accepted by members.

## 5. Presentation of the Accounts

Jon Linley presented the treasurer's report.

JL noted the impact of Covid 19 had had on the financial year: The accounts for 21/22 are presented alongside the 20/21 accounts. The year-end for RSG is March, which means 21/22 was after the deepest impacts of COVID-19, whilst 20/21 was affected less so. We are therefore looking at quite different scenarios when comparing 2021 to 2022 over and above just financial implications.

RSG had ended the year with a £60k surplus.

Income.

Contract Income had increased due to the Afghan scheme, generating £178k. This was not expected to be repeated next year.

Donations and grant income had increased compared to the previous year.

## Expenditure

Costs have increased: staff costs make up the majority of our costs. The staff team has increased by 8 over the year – caseworker and resettlement team members. Management and accommodation expenditure has increased in line with this. Expenditure on contactors for Ukraine and IT support have also increased.

Reserves comply with the Charity Commission recommendation of 3 months of running costs.

Overall, we have a stable position but must carefully plan for future ups and downs.

The Annual Accounts 2021 – 22 were accepted by members.

# 6. Election of New Trustees

The Chair explained that the constitution required one-third of the board to stand down each year. This quota has to be made up of the longest-serving trustees:

MM informed the AGM that Patrick Ismond and Richard Hanson James were not standing for re-election.

Thabo Makuyana is standing for re-election.

The board of trustees have also appointed two new trustees, Sam Lee and Sarah Seddon, during this year. These appointments need to be ratified by the membership.

MM asked members for permission to have a block vote. There were no objections to this.

TM was re-elected. SL and SN were confirmed as trustees.

MM welcomed new trustees to the board. MM paid tribute to PI, RHJ and Emma Broomfield, who stood down this year for their contribution to the board, noting that RHJ intends to continue volunteering.

MM introduced the special resolution regarding the changing of our name from 'Reading Refugee Support Group' to 'Refugee Support Group' and explained for the resolution to be passed, 75% of the members present needed to support it.
